Notting Hill Genesis is a housing association and registered provider of social housing. We work in the community, providing homes for around 170,000 people across London.

We were chosen as Southwark Council's development partner for the Aylesbury regeneration in early 2014. The Notting Hill Genesis team working on the Aylesbury regeneration manage the design and construction of the new buildings and surrounding public

space. We'll also be the new landlord for tenants and leaseholders moving into the new homes we build. Throughout the lifetime of the project we'll be working with local partners to create job and training opportunities and offer new ways for residents to get involved in the regeneration.


First Development Site demolition update

Demolition works on the First Development Site are being carried out by specialist demolition company, **Erith Contractors Ltd.** This is Erith's progress update.

We are now working on the remaining blocks on the First Development Site. We have completed demolition of the last remaining Chartridge block. It took two weeks to complete this and we are now removing all foundations and obstructions below slab level. The pictures below show the progress.



We have started the top down demolition of Chiltern (the block alongside Portland Street). The below sequence of images show how this will be done.

Traffic Management

Over the next few months, more traffic will be accessing the site from Albany Road.



This site access is shared with Hill (construction company) and is controlled by both contractors' certified and wellrespected traffic marshals.

Traffic marshals organise plant, deliveries and machinery both in and out of the site, ensuring the safety of surrounding pedestrians and traffic ,while logging all incoming and outgoing vehicles.

Pest Control

Erith have placed strategic baiting stations around the site to minimise the risk of pests. These baiting stations are monitored with all findings recorded on a weekly basis.



Environmental Aspects



Noisy periods may occur during work hours now that we have started demolition on Chiltern. Throughout this process, noise levels are regularly monitored and any readings exceeding the limit for a sustained period of time will be reviewed and revised accordingly. Baseline readings have been taken before any works begin.

Erith's demolition works may also generate some dust. There are controlled measures in place to monitor the dust levels and we use water suppression units (plumes of finely atomised water droplets projected into the air) to dampen down the dust as the work progresses. These keep dust levels down.

Vibration is monitored weekly by an engineer over the course of the demolition stages using handheld and remote monitors. The statistics produced will be reviewed against baseline measurements. Any excessive levels will be dealt with efficiently.

First Development Site construction update

Construction works on the first part of the First Development Site are being carried out by Hill. The contract with Hill will deliver 229 new homes in contract A. 84% of which will be social rented homes. We anticipate that the first new homes will be ready in summer 2021. As well as new homes, the First Development Site will also provide a new community facility, a public square and two new parks. This is Hill's progress update.

We started work in March 2019 by setting up the site and putting security in place. Next, we started ground works and installed the pile foundations for the three blocks in contract A.

Works to the superstructure (the part of the building above its foundations) are progressing and we have five tower cranes on site to work on sub-plot 1, sub-plot 2 and sub-plot 6. The concrete frame on subplot 2 is progressing well, and groundworks to sub-plot 1 and sub-plot 6 are nearly complete.

We are currently constructing the on-site road way, which will form our own separate site access road from Albany Road.



Plot 18 update

Plot 18 will be a new hub for the community at the heart of the neighbourhood. It will provide new homes, a library, a GP surgery and health centre, community and retail facilities and a public square.

We are finalising agreements with our preferred contractor to carry out the construction works on Plot 18. Work is expected to start on site early in the new year. More information will be available in the next update.

Case Study: Shantelle's Story

Shantelle is a local businesswoman and entrepreneur. She sells personalised baby clothing, bibs and baby grows but her most popular product is her bespoke hampers for parents with new-born babies. Much of Shantelle's business so far has come from word of mouth but she is now looking to grow her business and find part-time work to supplement her income.

Shantelle had signed up to the Southwark Startups in London Libraries (SiLL) programme, a project which supports business start-ups. To help her get more support with her business and access to various training and employment opportunities, Shantelle's mentor at SiLL referred her to Tarina, Training and Employment Project Manager at Notting Hill Genesis.

Tarina suggested that Shantelle applied for a Working Communities Bursary. This Notting Hill

Genesis scheme provides financial assistance to Southwark residents to support them to achieve employment and educational outcomes. Shantelle was successful with her application and was able to put the bursary to good use. She used the money to buy public liability insurance and a gazebo, as well as stock to enable her to create more products.

As she was now equipped to sell at markets, Tarina offered Shantelle the opportunity to sell her products through Notting Hill Genesis' Enterprise Zone at Camberwell Fair.

Speaking about the experience, Shantelle said, "Camberwell Fair was a nice experience. It was good to get out there and talk to people and I sold a few things. The bursary helped a lot. Now that I have my insurance and a gazebo, I'm hoping to do more events and markets."

She added, "Tarina's also helped me to improve my CV and suggested job opportunities which suit my skills. The opportunities and advice that Tarina has given me have really helped me. She's given me inspiration and motivation to develop my business and help finding part-time work so I now feel that there's light at the end of the tunnel!"

"Notting Hill Genesis is really supportive and I'd definitely recommend people speak to the team about training and employment opportunities, even if it's just to discuss their options."

Celebrating Black History Month

We celebrated Black History Month in October half-term, hosting activities for all the family.

The creative craft sessions were run by Holistic Well Women - an outstanding local group who we have been working with for a number of years in the Aylesbury community. At the sessions, local residents learnt how to design and create their own African print jewellery and t-shirts while learning about African culture through design and discussion.

Funding awarded to local groups

We've awarded £15,000 to nine different local groups to run community projects in the Aylesbury neighbourhood. The funding has been awarded thanks to Notting Hill Genesis' Aylesbury Community Grants scheme.

The fund is now in its fifth year and has given out over £75,000 to date.


